

Child Health Liaison (CHL) Online Course

Frequently Asked Questions

Who should take the CHL online course?

The Child Health Liaison online course is a training resource for early care and education providers interested in improving health and safety in their programs. The course is appropriate for anyone providing out-of-home care, including providers in family child care homes, Head Start Programs, child care centers and preschools.

Which health and safety topics are addressed in the CHL curriculum?

The Child Health Liaison online course includes the following ten modules:

- Module 1: Health and Safety in Child Care
- Module 2: Preventing Illnesses and Communicable Diseases
- Module 3: Immunizations and Emergency Preparedness
- Module 4: Safety and Injury Prevention
- Module 5: Nutrition and Food Safety
- Module 6: Oral Health
- Module 7: Social and Emotional Health
- Module 8: Child Abuse and Neglect Prevention
- Module 9: Medical Home and Children with Special Health Care Needs
- Module 10: Staff Health

Should students complete the modules in a specific order?

Begin with Module 1 for an overview of the role of the Child Health Liaison and general information about health and safety in child care. Once you have finished Module 1, the remaining modules may be completed in any order you choose. Take the CHL final exam after completing all ten modules.

What type of continuing education credits can I receive for completing the CHL online course?

Completion of all ten CHL modules is equivalent to 15 contact hours. Upon passing the CHL final exam, you will be able to print out a certificate of course completion to document these contact hours.
